

New Orleans Will Host the Combined Otolaryngology Spring Meetings May 14-18, 2025

NEW ORLEANS, LA – The 2025 Combined Otolaryngology Spring Meetings (COSM)—a joint meeting of eight otolaryngological societies—will be held May 14-18, 2025, in New Orleans, LA. The meeting will feature hundreds of scientific presentations highlighting research in progress in otolaryngology (head and neck surgery). Each participating society presents its own highly educational scientific program to the nearly 3,000 otolaryngologists and otolaryngology residents who typically attend the meeting.

The COSM program includes guest lectures by prominent leaders in surgery; numerous courses and scientific sessions; dozens of papers reflecting research related to current issues in the diagnosis, evaluation, and treatment of otolaryngology-related conditions; and two scientific poster receptions, featuring more than 850 posters and a "Meet the Leaders in Otolaryngology" events where trainees can gain insight and guidance from experts in their field. More than 80 companies will display products or services that provide solutions for managing diseases and disorders of the ear, nose, throat, and related structures of the head and neck and over 100 affiliate meetings and events are scheduled to take place during COSM.
